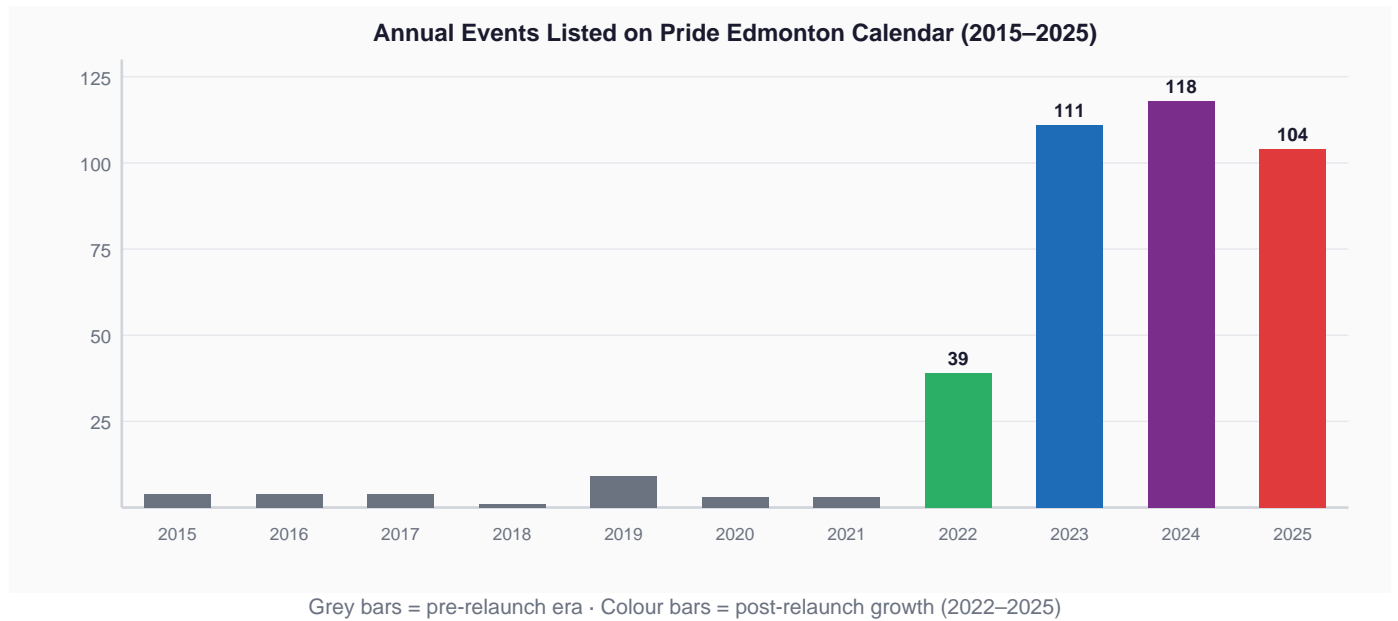

Key Narrative & Growth Drivers

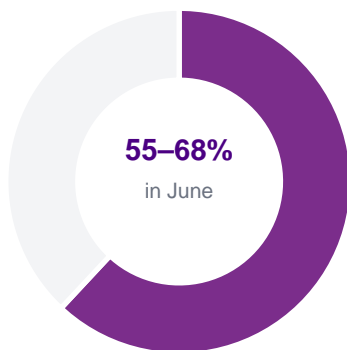
Following a 2022 relaunch of Pride celebrations, Pride Edmonton rapidly scaled from **39 events to over 100 annually** — reflecting strong adoption by community organizations, businesses, and independent producers across the Greater Edmonton Region.

Role of Explore Edmonton & the Guide to Pride

Explore Edmonton engaged **Ron Byers** to create an annual *Guide to Pride*. This initiative:

- Encouraged event submissions from new and returning organizers
- Strengthened connections between Pride Edmonton and the broader community
- Provided free promotion through the Pride Edmonton Events Calendar
- Directly contributed to growth from **39 events in 2022 to over 100 annually**

Seasonal Concentration



June accounts for 55–68% of annual events.

June–August (Summer of Pride) represents 70–86% of total events.

This highly concentrated workload period demands high-volume coordination and rapid calendar management from the Pride Edmonton team.

March — Spring Pride

14–20 events annually, driven by educational institutions and campus Pride programming across MacEwan, NAIT, U of A, NorQuest, and partner campuses.

Operational Implications

Managing a 100+ event calendar requires significant ongoing coordination, especially during the peak summer season.

High-Volume Coordination

Managing 100+ event listings per year across the Greater Edmonton Region.

Rapid Updates

Time-sensitive changes during June–August peak period require quick turnaround.

Year-Round Presence

Spring Pride (March) adds a second high-demand window each calendar year.

Free Platform Access

Zero cost to organizers ensures maximum community participation and equity.

Pride Edmonton's calendar is more than an event listing — it is a critical piece of community infrastructure that makes Pride **visible, accessible, and celebrated** across the Greater Edmonton Region. From four events in 2015 to over 100 annually today, the platform continues to grow as a trusted hub for 2SLGBTQIA+ programming.
